New Student Registration

School Expectations

There are school expectations the staff at Hilltop High School believes to be important to ensure the success of your child in our school setting. Abiding by these expectations will greatly assist in promoting a safe and caring school environment. Your cooperation is appreciated.

Respectful Communication

Definition: Appropriate communication between staff members, between students, between students and staff, and between students, staff and parents. Appropriate communication is the practice of non-heated conversations, positive body language, appropriate volume, tone and choice of language, as well as active listening.

Expectation: Respectful communication is to be used at all times.

Lates/Attendance

Definition: Lates: coming after the usual, proper or expected time. Attendance: being in the classroom and actively learning

Expectation: Students are expected to arrive in class before the bell rings and attend class on a daily basis.

Please be advised of our new late/attendance policy.

Absences: All absences must be excused by the students' parents or teachers. This means the parent or guardian must call in, in order for the absence to be acknowledged. If there is no call or notification, then it will be considered <u>unexcused</u> and an automated call will go home that night. The following day, the student will be admitted to class without parent contact, but the student will receive a lunch hour detention. If the parent contacts the office before 11:30 AM, the detention will be cancelled. If a parent does not contact the office, the student will be called to the office for detention at lunch. (We feel this parent contact is vital for success, therefore, they must contact us before the detention is cancelled)

Lates: When students are late to class, they must have a late slip issued by the office in order to be admitted. Students are not to be admitted to class without one. The exception to this is if there is a test/exam in the class the student is late for. Once the student has completed the test/exam, he/she should go to the office to receive the late slip. Students whose parents have called the school to notify us of the late will be issued a late slip. Those students without calls will be issued a late slip and a detention equal to the amount of time they missed from class. The detention is to be served at lunch the following day. Students who are repeat offenders will be issued in-school suspensions by administration.

Loitering

Definition: Spending time idly; lingering without purpose.

Expectation: No loitering in the hallways and lunchroom. Students are to be in class. If students are on spares, they are expected to work in the library quietly, go outside or leave campus entirely.

Appropriate Dress

Definition: Wearing clothing that is respectful of the learning environment.

Expectation: Students and staff will wear clothing that is non-revealing and does not have inappropriate slogans.

Cell Phones or Text Capable Electronics

Definition: Any devise capable of making a phone call or text messaging.

Expectation: Cell phones or text capable electronics are not allowed in class unless authorized by a teacher. They are off limits in all exams.

Smoking, Vaping and Restricted Areas

Hilltop High School is a smoke/vap-free zone. It is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 years to smoke or be in possession of nicotine. Senior High students who are of legal age must be off school property. The arena parking lot, curling rink and back alley area are out of bounds for grade 9 students from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. All Students are not allowed to leave the school building during class or during the break between classes. Cigarettes, vaporizers and any illegal paraphernalia will be confiscated and not returned.







*Alberta Education has decided that Diploma results will only be available via your MyPass account. *The school cannot create your account on your behalf.

How to sign-up:

1. Go to mypass.alberta.ca

- 2. Create a login using "Sign me up, I'm new!" Do not use your @ngps.ca email. A confirmation link will be sent to your personal inbox.
- 3. Click on the confirmation link in your inbox. Confirm your birthdate and Alberta Student Number. You can find your ASN at https://extranetapp.learning.gov.ab.ca/learnerRegistry/forms/
- 4. Using a button on the subsequent screen, request that a secure verification code be mailed to your home via post. It should arrive within two weeks.
 - 5. Upon receipt in the mail, login and enter the code. It will expire. Act promptly.
 - 6. You will now have access to all of your academic records.

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



Grades 6 and 9 Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) Quick Facts for Parents/Guardians

What are PATs?

Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) are administered to students in grades 6 and 9 and have three main purposes:

- · to determine if students are learning what they are expected to learn;
- to report to Albertans how well students have achieved provincial standards at given points in their schooling;
- · to assist schools, authorities, and the province in monitoring and improving student learning.

When are PATs administered?

PATs are administered in May and June annually in English and French language arts, mathematics, science and social studies in grade 6 and grade 9. Some grade 9 students write PATs in January of each year.

Are there any practice questions my child can do before writing PATs?

Yes. Students can try out the released questions from previous PATs that are located at https://questaplus.alberta.ca/PracticeMain.html.

When will I find out my child's PAT results?

After PATs are administered, school staff share the preliminary results with parents. Each fall, Individual Student Results (ISPs) are made available to schools that contain official student results. School staff then share the ISPs with parents and keep a record of the ISP on the student's record in accordance with the Student Record Regulation.

THE POWER OF A FRESH START

As a child I had a love/hate relationship with returning to school after summer break. I loved getting a new outfit, the smell of a fresh box of crayons, and the feel of a brand new pad of paper. Growing up on a farm, summer meant infrequent visits with my friends, so September brought renewed social engagements and the potential seemed endless. I loved the excitement of finding out who was in my homeroom and who my teacher would be. I loved the lunch items my mom would have stocked in our fridge and pantry. I loved the new resolutions I would make for myself, such as: I will have my lunch and clothes ready the night before, complete my homework early, achieve honors, be brave and try-out for the school team or drama production, etc. On the other side of the coin, I hated to say goodbye to my dog and my horse, not being able to sleep in, and not having my evenings free to play and watch TV. I hated the thought of getting on the school bus in the cold and the dark, and the thought that I might have that bothersome kid in my class or the teacher that yells.

Now, as a mom of four, I continue to have a love/hate with back to school. Hove getting my family back on schedule, I love the excitement on the kids' faces when we find that "perfect" outfit, I love not having to listen to the kids bicker from the moment their eyes open, not hollering for the 567th time to "Shut Off Fortnight! You have been playing for 36 hours straight!" I love not planning activities and chores to keep the kids entertained and off their electronics, I love the new resolutions we plan as a family: pack lunches the night before, go to bed early, have an organized homework schedule, etc. I love the promises of new heights my children will soar in the school year and goals they will accomplish. But, alas... I hate the end of the long, warm, quiet days. I hate the panic I feel trying to organize all their school supplies and signing the 6000 forms. I hate spending \$28, 425 on school clothes! I hate watching our family calendar quickly fill up and over flow. I hate the tightness in my throat and the stinging in my eyes as I wave goodbye to each one, knowing they're not so little anymore

I am not alone when it comes to the stress and anxiety I feel preparing for back to school. According to Parents Magazine, September 2017 by Amanda First "


48% of moms say they're extremely concerned about managing their family's schedules once school starts. 86% are worried about the quality and healthfulness of their children's school lunches. 94% say protecting their children from bullying is a major back-to-school concern. 47% find it difficult to fit in quality time with the whole family once school starts. 4 out of 5 of moms see back-to-school as a chance for a fresh start, not just for their kids but for themselves as well. 69% of moms are concerned about their children's academic performance. More than half (58%) of moms worry about staying on budget for back-to-school shopping. 82% of moms say back-to-school season is their biggest shopping time of the year.

How can we be realistic on our expectations and embrace the power of a fresh start?

- Talk with your family about goals for the upcoming school year with practical, simple steps that will help your family succeed in accomplishing them. WRITE THEM DOWN, then post them where you can all see it daily.

- Even if you don't have your kids back to a normal bedtime routine, its ok! Everyone will
 eventually adjust.
- Set a budget for school supplies and schools: not everything needs to be purchased right away.
 It's all right to buy supplies as you can afford them.
- Have an ongoing list on your phone or a notepad that is accessible of what needs to be completed before school begins
- Keep extra-curricular activities to a minimum. Our family rule is 1 activity per child per semester.
- Take pictures! Who cares if your child is scowling, or their hair is sticking up or their shirt missbuttoned. It only adds character.
- Remember your sense of humor and go easy on yourself (and your kids!) It's a stressful time for everyone: school staff, kids and parents.
- Don't compare yourself to the posts on social media of the seemingly "perfect families" on the first day of school. You never know what happens behind closed doors. We all lose it, some are just better at hiding it than others!
