APEGA Foundation Student Award 2018-2019

1. Brief description of the Yellowhead Branch of APEGA:

The Yellowhead Branch of APEGA is comprised of APEGA Members that have one main thing in common: Love for their Professions. We are all volunteers that dedicate part of our "free time" to promote and enhance the professions of engineering and geoscience at the local level by engaging APEGA members and the public.

2. Purpose of the Student Award:

Attracting and retaining engineers and geoscientists in rural work locations is very challenging. One solution to this problem is to encourage passionate students from rural locations to consider engineering and geoscience as their field of study as they may be more likely to be attracted back to a rural location. A student award from APEGA could raise their awareness of engineering and geoscience as options of study for students with high marks in math and science. This award is sponsored by the APEGA Foundation and presented by the Yellowhead Branch of the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of Alberta (APEGA).

3. Description of the Student Award/Eligibility:

Ten (10) awards of \$150 awarded in Grade 12 for aggregate marks above 80% in Math 20C, Physics 20 and Chemistry 20 and a description of their individual pursuit (community involvement, innovative projects, interesting extracurricular hobby or activity) from the following schools:
