- * Please remember that ALL students must be signed out by a parent/ guardian when leaving the building for any reason, including in the event of an emergency or evacuation. Students can be signed out by a parent/ guardian either in person or by calling the school at 780-778-2446.
- * If there is no call or notification of a students absence from a parent or guardian then it will be considered unexcused and an automated call will go home that night. Please be advised if our system has rejected your phone number due to a cancelled landline, we will use the next available phone number (ex: cell phone number)
- * Please contact the school to verify your contact information if you have any concerns.

NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION



We are still accepting new student registration. Registration packages can be found on our website at hilltophigh.ca, please contact the school to schedule an intake meeting with administration before registering. Our office is open, Monday - Friday from 8:00 am - 4:00 pm.

School Expectations

There are school expectations the staff at Hilltop High School believes to be important to ensure the success of your child in our school setting. Abiding by these expectations will greatly assist in promoting a safe and caring school environment. Your cooperation is appreciated.

Respectful Communication

Definition: Appropriate communication between staff members, between students, between students and staff, and between students, staff and parents. Appropriate communication is the practice of non-heated conversations, positive body language, appropriate volume, tone and choice of language, as well as active listening.

Expectation: Respectful communication is to be used at all times.

Lates/Attendance

Definition: Lates: coming after the usual, proper or expected time. Attendance: being in the classroom and actively learning **Expectation:** Students are expected to arrive in class before the bell rings and attend class on a daily basis.



Please be advised of our revised late/attendance policy.

For the complete policy please refer to the student/parent handbook available on our website at hilltophigh.ca

Absences: All absences must be excused by the students' parents or teachers. This means the parent or guardian must call the school, in order for the absence to be acknowledged. If there is no call or notification, then it will be considered <u>unexcused</u> and an automated call will go home that night. The following day, the student will be admitted to class without parent contact, but the student will receive a lunch hour detention. If the parent contacts the office before 11:30 AM, the detention will be cancelled. If a parent does not contact the office, the student will be called to the office for detention at lunch. (We feel this parent contact is vital for success, therefore, they must contact us before the detention is cancelled) If students fail to show up for lunch time detention due to habitual lates and absents, a full day in-school suspension will be issued; the student then has opportunity to complete missed work (assignments, quizzes, and tests). Whether students are excused or unexcused from school, it is their responsibility to get caught up on missed work.

Lates: At the beginning of each semester, students will be issued five free late slips by their teacher. There are four blocks each day and thus these five free lates could be used in just 1.25 short days. Once these free admittances have been used, students will need to get a late slip from the office to be permitted into class. Parents/Guardians will have to call the office to acknowledge and excuse their students late by 11:30 am on the day of, otherwise the late student will be issued a minimum 15 minute detention at lunch or serve the amount of time the student is late, if greater than 15 minutes. If the student is late in the afternoon, they will be expected to receive a call acknowledging and excusing their absence by 11:30 am the following day. The exception to this is if there is a test/exam in the class for which the student is late. Those students without calls will be required to serve their 15 minute lunch detention as well as, talk to the teacher for whom they are late, to get missed work. When lates become habitual, contact will be made home by the teacher. When lates become chronic, it will become an office referral and/or a full day in-school suspension may be issued by administration. It is important for students to bring school work to lunch detention to allow them to get caught up on missed work.

Loitering

Definition: Spending time idly; lingering without purpose.

Expectation: No loitering in the hallways and lunchroom. Students are to be in class. If students are on spares, they are expected to work in the library quietly, go outside or leave campus entirely.

Appropriate Dress

Definition: Wearing clothing that is respectful of the learning environment.

Expectation: Students and staff will wear clothing that is non-revealing and does not have inappropriate slogans.

Cell Phones or Text Capable Electronics

Definition: Any devise capable of making a phone call or text messaging.

Expectation: Cell phones or text capable electronics are not allowed in class unless authorized by a teacher. They are off limits in all exams.

Smoking, Vaping and Restricted Areas

Hilltop High School is a smoke/vap-free zone. It is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 years to smoke or be in possession of nicotine. Senior High students who are of legal age must be off school property. The arena parking lot, curling rink and back alley area are out of bounds for grade 9 students from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. All Students are not allowed to leave the school building during class or during the break between classes. Cigarettes, vaporizers and any illegal paraphernalia will be confiscated and not returned.

Gateway Academy is Hilltop High School's outreach program. This alternative program is designed for students that are unable to attend a traditional high school program. We offer programming for Grades 9 through 12. The program is based on Alberta Education's curriculum and students receive credit as they would in the regular program.

We offer a nurturing environment that supports not only academic development but emotional, social and intellectual growth. We also offer:

- Flexible time schedule;
- Individualized study program;
- Access to a variety of Core and Option courses;
- Personal Support (including access to counselling with a psychologist from Canniff & Associates)
- Staff mentorship to aid in planning high school courses and school-career transitions.
- Students may enroll in a partial program at the outreach while maintaining enrollment in other courses at their local high school.

The Gateway Academy Program is designed for students who:

- Are unsuccessful in the regular school setting;
- Prefer working independently and are highly self motivated;
- Need only a few credits to complete their high school diploma;
- Have work commitments or difficulties interfering with regular attendance;
- Are single parents who are unable to commit to a full-time program;
- May have experienced difficulties and dropped out of school;
- Have relocated mid-semester and are unable to register in regular school;
- Exhibit a desire to improve their education and career options.

We are located in downtown Whitecourt, on the corner of 51st Street and 51st Avenue (5104-51 Ave.)

Registration begins on Tuesday September 3, 2019. For more details, e-mail Mrs. Kendall @ maureen.kendall@ngps.ca or call (780) 778-5865.

STEPS TO REGISTER

Students wishing to register at Gateway Academy must complete a registration package available at the school. Current Hilltop students must first have permission form Hilltop administration before beginning the registration process.

Students must come to the school for an intake interview, which they may schedule or attend on a drop-in basis. As well as your completed registration package, make sure you have the following information ready for your intake meeting:

- Birth Certificate or passport
- Legal first and last name
- Name of last school attended and contact person (Phone number if possible)
- If you have completed Grade 9 and have not been registered in a high school, a report card from Grade 9 must be provided.

Completion of the package does not guarantee acceptance into the program.

Staff may require time to gather information to determine whether or not

Gateway Academy can provide the appropriate education.

Applying for Post-Secondary

Most schools accept applications from October 1st onward. Do not delay. Receiving an offer of acceptance can take a long time. Remember, once you have applied, you must periodically update the postsecondary institution via your online account.

Work Experience

Are you a student who is currently employed? Have you signed up for work experience? You can earn up to 15 credits towards your high school diploma. Completion of HCS 3000 course modules is mandatory.



MYPASS.ALBERTA.CA

To access your records after writing a diploma, you will need to have a myPass.alberta.ca account established. **GRADE 12 STUDENTS MUST SIGN UP FOR MyPass**

*Alberta Education has decided that Diploma results will only be available via your MyPass account. *The school cannot create your account on your hehalf

How to sign-up:

1. Go to mypass.alberta.ca

- 2. Create a login using "Sign me up, I'm new!" Do not use your @ngps.ca email. A confirmation link will be sent to your personal inbox.
- 3. Click on the confirmation link in your inbox. Confirm your birthdate and Alberta Student Number. You can find your ASN at https:// extranetapp.learning.gov.ab.ca/learnerRegistry/forms/
 - 4. Using a button on the subsequent screen, request that a secure verification code be mailed to your home via post. It should arrive within two weeks.
 - 5. Upon receipt in the mail, login and enter the code. It will expire. Act promptly.
 - 6. You will now have access to all of your academic records.

SURVIVING THE RETURN TO SCHOOL (for parents!)

I saw this sign at a hockey rink the other day and I thought how relevant it is in regards to our children returning to school. We all want our children to be successful and success is measured in many ways, not just academically.

"Your child's success or lack of success in sports doesn't not indicate what kind of parent you are.

But having an athlete that is coachable, respectful, a great teammate,

mentally tough, resilient, and tries their best IS a direct reflection of your parenting"

It's that joyful, stressful, exciting, anxiety inducing time of year again for all of us: BACK TO SCHOOL. I have heard it said, students returning to school after 2 months of vacation is like trying to run a marathon after lying on the couch all summer! Children are often completely off their regular routines, diet, nutrition, sleep, activities, not to mention, they are likely not reading a lot or practicing math! There may be some jitters: new friends, new teachers, challenging school work and anticipating new transitions. We parents can have similar jitters: new teachers, maybe new school, new parent friends, etc. We feel panic at how we are going to do it all and vow that "this year it will be different!".

I am sharing with you some tried and tested (by me, a super busy mom of 4) that may help you survive the return to school. But first I need to say this, for all you exhausted and frazzled parents trying to do everything on your own (and I cannot emphasize this enough!): get your children on board to help you! I am a firm believer of the notion "Do not do for your child what they can do for themselves". If your child is old enough to go to school, they are old enough to take on some responsibilities.

- 1. Save panic by downloading school supply lists on line and having the local stationary store prepare it for you. What a stress relief!
- 2. Find *lunch box inspirations*: think roll-ups, wraps, Bento boxes (just a healthier, fancy Lunchable), left overs in a thermos, cheese/crackers/pickles. With encouragement and guidance, by age 7, (in my humble opinion) children should be able to make most of their lunch on their own.
- 3. Talk a lot about your child's school friends. It will get them excited about who they haven't seen for a while.
- 4. Go to the school, play in the playground, and walk around the building to ensure they know the doors to go in and out of.
- 5. Keep a *family calendar*, either digital if all your children can access it, a whiteboard or an old fashion paper one. It helps prepare children for what is coming, so they know what to expect and hopefully provide smoother transitions.
- **6.** Create an *accessible* and *convenient* routine for all the paper that comes into your home: hanging file folders, individual storage boxes or crates, wall folders. Whatever works for you, your family and the space in your home.
- 7. Go through the letters, notes and agenda items each and every day. Many tears have been shed in my house over missed permission forms and upcoming activities that they were not able to attend because we did not complete the forms!
- 8. Help your children organize their tasks, chores and responsibilities by creating a chart, lists or reminders throughout the house. I am talking signs or notes taped to doors, TV's, mirrors, etc. on things such as what to pack in their backpack, their jobs, chores or homework after school.
- 9. Bring closure to the end of summer by doing a memorable family activity: picnic, going for ice cream, playing board games, visit a museum, have a different dinner (fondue, indoor grill, make your own pizza). Talk about some of the memories you created over the summer and what you are all looking forward to in the new school year.
- 10. Screen time is a constant battle in my household. It wreaks havoc on proper exercise, homework and sleep. If you have this issue as well, consider contacting your Wi-Fi provider about available options to set time limits for devices. Utilize "Apple Screen Time", "Google Family Link" already on your smart phone or download an app such as "Our Pact", "Questodio" or "Mobicip" which are all very effective at a minimal cost.

I have to admit, I begin each school year with good intentions and enthusiastic optimism of staying organized and in control - only to feel like I am losing my grip on everything by October 1st. But like we teach our children: every time you fall, get back up again! Welcome back to Northern Gateway Public Schools! We are all in this together, we got this, and we are just getting started!
