COVID-19 ALBERTA HEALTH DAILY CHECKLIST (FOR CHILDREN UNDER 18)

Overview

This checklist applies for all children, as well as all students who attend kindergarten through Grade 12, including high school students over 18. Children should be screened every day by completing this checklist before going to school, childcare or other activities. Children may need a parent or guardian to assist them to complete this screening tool.

If your child has traveled outside Canada in the last 14 days, follow the <u>Government of Canada Travel, Testing,</u>
<u>Quarantine and Borders</u> instructions, including any requirements for exempt travelers related to attending high-risk
environments.

Screening Questions for Children under 18:

Fever Temperature of 38 degrees Celsius or higher	YES	NO
Cough Continuous, more than usual, not related to other known causes or conditions such as asthma	YES	NO
Shortness of breath Continuous, unable to breathe deeply, not related to other known causes or conditions such as asthma	YES	NO
Loss of sense of smell or taste Not related to other known causes or conditions like allergies or neurological disorders	YES	NO

If the child answered "YES" to any symptom in question 1:

- The child is required to isolate for 10 days from onset of symptoms as per <u>CMOH Order 39-2021</u> OR receive
 a negative COVID-19 test and feel better before returning to activities
- Use the <u>AHS Online Assessment Tool</u> or call Health Link 811 to arrange for testing and to receive additional
 information on isolation.

If the child answered "NO" to all of the symptoms in question 1, proceed to question 2.

Does the child have any new onset (or worsening) of the following other symptoms: Chills YES NO Without fever, not related to being outside in cold weather YES NO Sore throat/painful swallowing Not related to other known causes/conditions, such as seasonal allergies or reflux YES NO Runny nose/congestion Not related to other known causes/conditions, such as seasonal allergies or being outside in cold weather Feeling unwell/fatigued NO Lack of energy, poor feeding in infants, not related to other known causes or conditions, such as depression, insomnia, thyroid dysfunction or sudden injury YES Nausea, vomiting and/or diarrhea NO Not related to other known causes/conditions, such as anxiety, medication or irritable bowel syndrome Unexplained loss of appetite YES NO Not related to other know Muscle/joint aches YES NO Not related to other known causes/conditions, such as arthritis or injury YES NO Headache Not related to other known causes/conditions, such as tension-type headaches or chronic YES NO Conjunctivitis (commonly known as pink eye)

If the child answered "YES" to ONE symptom in question 2:

- Keep your child home and monitor for 24 hours
- If their symptom is improving after 24 hours, they can return to school and activities when they feel well
 enough to go. Testing is not necessary.
- If the symptom does not improve or worsens after 24 hours (or if additional symptoms emerge), use the <u>AHS Online Assessment Tool</u> or call Health Link 811 to check if testing is recommended.

If the child answered "YES" to TWO OR MORE symptoms in question 2:

- Keep your child home.
- Use the AHS Online Assessment Tool or call Health Link 811 to determine if testing is recommended.
- Your child can return to school and activities once their symptoms go away as long as it has been at least 24
 hours since their symptoms started.

If the child answered "NO" to all questions:

Your child may attend school, childcare and/or other activities.

Please note: If your child is experiencing any symptoms from the lists above, do not bring them to visit a continuing care or acute care facility for 10 days from when symptoms started or until symptoms resolve (whichever is longer), unless they receive a negative COVID-19 test result and feel better.

School Expectations

There are school expectations the staff at Hilltop High School believes to be important to ensure the success of your child in our school setting. Abiding by these expectations will greatly assist in promoting a safe and caring school environment. Your cooperation is appreciated.

Respectful Communication

Definition: Appropriate communication between staff members, between students, between students and staff, and between students, staff and parents. Appropriate communication is the practice of non-heated conversations, positive body language, appropriate volume, tone and choice of language, as well as active listening.

Expectation: Respectful communication is to be used at all times.

Please be advised of our revised late/attendance policy.

Absences/Lates/Attendance

Absences: All absences must be excused by the students' parents/guardians or teachers on the day of the absence. This means the parent or guardian must call the school, in order for the absence to be acknowledged. If there is no call or notification, then it will be considered <u>unexcused</u> and an automated call will go home. The following day, the student will be admitted to class without parent contact, but the student will receive an automatic referral for FLEX due to missed instruction time

Lates: Students who are less than 15 minutes late for class will be admitted to class. Once the front door is locked, students who are late will require a phone call from their parent/guardian acknowledging their late. Students will then be permitted to class. Classroom teachers may implement their own policies to make up for time missed due to lates.

Loitering

Definition: Spending time idly; lingering without purpose.

Expectation: No loitering in the hallways and lunchroom. Students are to be in class. If students are on spares, they are expected to work in the library quietly, go outside or leave campus entirely.

Appropriate Dress

Definition: Wearing clothing that is respectful of the learning environment.

Expectation: Students will dress appropriately for school. That is, non-revealing (modest) clothing, without inappropriate or offensive slogans and/or references. All clothing should ensure underwear remains covered.

Cell Phones or Text Capable Electronics

Definition: Any devise capable of making a phone call or text messaging.

Expectation: Cell phones or text capable electronics are not allowed in class unless authorized by a teacher. They are off limits in all exams.

Smoking, Vaping and Restricted Areas

Hilltop High School is a smoke/vap-free zone. It is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 years to smoke or be in possession of nicotine. Senior High students who are of legal age must be off school property. The arena parking lot, curling rink and back alley area are out of bounds for grade 9 students from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. All Students are not allowed to leave the school building during class or during the break between classes. Cigarettes, vaporizers and any illegal paraphernalia will be confiscated and not returned.

Welcome Ms. Petra Lewis to Gateway Academy!

Gateway Academy is Hilltop High School's outreach program. This alternative program is designed for students that are unable to attend a traditional high school program. We offer programming for Grades 9 through 12. The program is based on Alberta Education's curriculum and students receive credit as they would in the regular program.

We offer a nurturing environment that supports not only academic development but emotional, social and intellectual growth. We also offer:

- Flexible time schedule;
- Individualized study program;
- Access to a variety of Core and Option courses;
- Personal Support (including access to counselling with a psychologist from Canniff & Associates)
- Staff mentorship to aid in planning high school courses and school-career transitions.
- Students may enroll in a partial program at the outreach while maintaining enrollment in other courses at their local high school.

The Gateway Academy Program is designed for students who:

- Are unsuccessful in the regular school setting;
- Prefer working independently and are highly self motivated;
- Need only a few credits to complete their high school diploma;
- Have work commitments or difficulties interfering with regular attendance;
- Are single parents who are unable to commit to a full-time program;
- May have experienced difficulties and dropped out of school;
- Have relocated mid-semester and are unable to register in regular school;
- Exhibit a desire to improve their education and career options.

We are located in downtown Whitecourt, on the corner of 51st Street and 51st Avenue (5104-51 Ave.)

STEPS TO REGISTER

Students wishing to register at Gateway Academy must complete a registration package available at the school. Current Hilltop students must first have permission from Hilltop administration before beginning the registration process.

Students must come to the school for an intake interview, which they may schedule or attend on a drop-in basis. As well as your completed registration package, make sure you have the following information ready for your intake meeting:

- Birth Certificate or passport
- Legal first and last name
- Name of last school attended and contact person (Phone number if possible)
- If you have completed Grade 9 and have not been registered in a high school, a report card from Grade 9 must be provided.

Completion of the package does not guarantee acceptance into the program. Staff may require time to gather information to determine whether or not Gateway Academy can provide the appropriate education.

With the start of another school year, worry of what the year will bring is heavy on us all: parents, caregivers, teachers and students. Many of the messages I shared last year are still relevant at the start of the 2021-22 school year and are a great reminder to bring us strength:

*We need EVERYONE to be healthier than they have ever been: staff, student and families (that means physically, mentally, relationally)

*As caregivers, we have the most influence on resilience and the psychological wellness of our children. It is critical that we manage our own angst of the school year, because our children will pick up on our feelings. We are strong, brave and adaptable, and so are our children!

*Regardless of the boat we are in, we are all in this COVID-19 storm together.

*Let us navigate with *respect, empathy, courage and responsibility.* Throw a lifeline to the ones who are struggling, accept a lifeline if someone reaches out to help.

*From the words of Dr. Jody Carrington: We are fighting a virus, not each other.

*Focus, point out and grasp onto the brief moments of *normalcy, joy and delight* like our lives depend on it. Share the message to our children: *all hard times come to an end, and will give way to the promise of better days ahead.*

Michael Franklin with CTV News published an article on August 27, 2021 that I feel all families in Northern Gateway can benefit. The Alberta Blue Cross recently partnered with two other organizations, Kickstand (mykickstand.ca) and the Mental Health Foundation (mentalhealthfoundation.ca) to launch a messaging service that will help inspire young people throughout the school year.

The service, called *MoreGoodDays*, delivers advice and uplifting messages to mobile phones that are subscribed to its service. "Youth across Alberta can text 'MoreGoodDays' to <u>393939</u> to receive these daily text messages for free," the company said in a release. All of the messages sent out from the service are written by youth, for youth.

"I think something you should know is that you are green with great, pink with perfect, aqua with awesome, blue with brave. You are a rainbow of qualities. Remember that!" - MoreGoodDays Message written by a young person in Alberta

"Hi Friend! I noticed you're a bit stressed... let's unclench our jaw, drop our shoulders, relax our face and take a deep breath. In & Out. There we go! Much better. Have a great day :)" - MoreGoodDays Message written by a young person in Alberta

"Don't forget that rest is okay. We don't always have to be working in order to feel productive. Rest can be productive too." - More Good Days message from Albertan young person

"Children are very resilient," said Brian Geslinger, vice-president of corporate relations at Alberta Blue Cross and a father of three school-aged children, in a statement. "But, like all of us, the pandemic has brought massive change in our lives – and even as we see the light at the end of the pandemic tunnel, we need to be aware that many children are still deeply affected by the stress and uncertainty."

Sadly, we are still living in uncertainty, but that does not mean we cannot look forward to the school year and embrace it with optimism. Despite the challenges we have before us, do not forget everything we have overcome. We will get through this too - TOGETHER, because together, we can have More Good Days.
