#### A. School Profile

Focus Question: Who are we?

Hilltop High School is a Grade 9-12 high school located in the town of Whitecourt. Hilltop also operates an Outreach Program named Hilltop's Storefront School. Whitecourt is a town of 10,000 people built mainly on the forestry and oil industries. Due to the nature of the industries, Whitecourt has a high rate of transitory workers. This translates into the school system as well.

Number of certificated and non-certificated staff: Hilltop High School has a teaching staff of 25.130 FTE teaching staff. The Storefront campus has a teaching contingent of 1.0 FTE. We also have 14 support staff which includes a 0.75 FNMI Liaison Worker, three secretarial staff, a full-time computer technician, a librarian and seven education assistants.

#### **B. School Highlights**

Focus Question: What is exciting and unique to our school?

Hilltop High School offers a comprehensive program of core, Career and Technology Studies and option courses. We offer multiple classes in most courses as well as Art, Construction, Cosmetology, Computer Sciences, Drama, Foods, Mechanics, Photography and Welding. In addition, our students have access to the Registered Apprenticeship Program, Work Experience and Dual Credit programs. We are proud of the wide range of choice students have at Hilltop. We have a number of staff members who have their journeyman certificate in their trades and can, therefore, offer students a higher level of programming than other schools in the area.

Hilltop students have access to programming that meets their needs. In addition to the robust regular programming, we offer Knowledge and Employability, Life Skills as well as a fully-staffed student services department for students to meet their educational and emotional needs. In addition, we offer extra counseling services through CANNIFF and Associates as part of the Aspen Student Health Program.

Hilltop operates an alternative education program through Hilltop's Storefront School. The Storefront program is designed for students who do not find success in the regular high school program, or, for students who are self-motivated to work through high school at their own pace.

Hilltop High School also offers students a number of elements of high school redesign, even though we are not an official redesign school. Students have to opportunity to participate in FLEX twice a month. Students can self-nominate, or be nominated by parents or teachers to attend FLEX tutorials. We also offer students in in-reach program where they can take courses that are not offered as part of our regular course offerings. In addition, Hilltop High School offers the only summer school program in Northern Gateway Public Schools.

Hilltop also has a very successful extra-curricular program that includes sports, drama, photography, and humanitarian opportunities. Our sports teams are competitive at both the local and provincial levels. We host the community high school football team, the Whitecourt Cats. Hilltop students make up the majority of the players and Hilltop staff make up the coaching staff of the team. We also offer students the opportunity to participate in cross-country running, golf, basketball, volleyball, and track and field. Our drama program hosts a number of performances throughout the school year. Hilltop's Photography students take on jobs for local community groups including the Town of Whitecourt. They also offer services like passport photos and video services to the general community. This program emphasizes the entrepreneurial spirit of students. Hilltop's humanitarian group, HUGS, is a grassroots program that supports an orphanage in Uganda. HUGS provides a monthly allowance to take care of the educational needs of students in the orphanage. Students also participate in Yearbook Club, host Arts and CTF Night events. Our students also participate in Skills Canada events. We also have students involved in the Whitecourt Youth Advisory committee. The school hosts a Medieval Club, a Dungeons and Dragons Club and a School Reach club.

We also have a travel club that organizes a yearly international trip. Students have travelled to Great Britain, France, Italy, Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands, and more through the traveling road show group. Students also take part in local and national field trips as well. We regularly have students attend the Forum for Young Canadians in Ottawa. Students also participate in field trips for cosmetology, outdoor education and sports. Students also have the
